Phonics and Early Reading	Blanche Nevile Primary School use Floppy's Phonics Scheme to teach early reading and writing. All children learn differently and have different preferred communication methods, therefore, we use a combination of visual phonics, BSL, spoken English and whole word recognition.  The children are given appropriately levelled reading books from Collins Big Cat Reading Scheme. Children have access to their assigned reading books at home via Collins ebooks.  We also use 'Word Aware' to teach key words linked to topic.
